William Q. Mould 72 of Mableton, GA passed away on September 1, 2019.

William, (Bill) Jacob Quao Mould was Born in Accra, Ghana to Thomas York Mould Sr., and Rosalind Veronica Ayele Mensah Mould. William, or “Willie” (as he was fondly called by his family), was an extraordinary student. He completed the required 6 years of primary school in 4 years. When he entered Adisadel College, (Adisco), at the age of 13 he was 2 years younger than all of his classmates. His time at Adisco was well spent, academically and socially, it was there that he met lifelong friends Tralance Obuama Addy and Victor “Caution” Pappoe.

As young boys begin to claim their own identities, they often put aside their boyhood names in favor of, (in their eyes,) a more fitting moniker.

William/Willie became Bill, and to solidify his independent identity he added a nickname, Capelly. At Adisadel Bill continued to earn academic distinctions. In his London Advanced level exams he earned all A's in Physics, Mathematics & Further Mathematics. He became the first person in the country to do so.

Bill was also among the 1st group of Ghanaian students to receive the ASPAU scholarship to a college in the U.S. He attended the University of Connecticut, graduating in 1969 with a Bachelors of Science in Electrical Engineering.

Bill's first job was with GE in Pittsfield, Massachusetts, where he met and married his wife in 1970. Shortly after the wedding, the couple moved to Akosombo, Ghana, where he was employed as an engineer at the Volta River

Authority.

Returning to the U. S. Bill accepted a job at Forney Engineering, in Dallas Texas. It was in Dallas that his daughters Kamaria & Aisha were born. Forney had an onsite day care center and when they were old enough, Bill took his daughters to work with him everyday.

A favorite past time for Bill was debating any and all subjects. For him there were no murky areas. He insisted on the facts as he saw them. Above all else, Bill was a philosopher. His knowledge and interpretation of the fundamental philosophies of the ages was vast. Einstein was his favorite. He enjoyed playing devil's advocate. He also enjoyed being the life of the party. Bill Mould loved to dance, it can probably be said that he thought he was as good a dancer as he was an engineer.

In later life Bill moved to Georgia to be near his daughter and granddchildren. He took great pleasure in telling his family and friends about the accomplishments of his granddaughters. Ayele, Kai and Diarra.

Bill Mould lived life on his own terms. He had a generosity of spirit, a penchant for the outrageous, and a dedication to his own truth.

Preceding him in death are his parents Thomas and Rosalind Mould, and his daughter, Kamaria Ayele Adwoa Mould. Oh what a happy reunion!

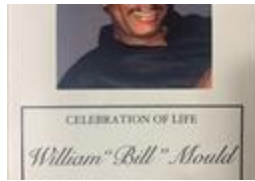
