Willie Daniel 'Chunkey' Elliott III was born on August 28, 1961, to the loving parents of Willie D. Elliott II and Shirley Elliott in Atlanta, GA. He was the middle child and the only son, and both of his parents preceded him in death. A 1980 graduate of Rockdale High School in Conyers, Dan soon after joined the United States Navy, where he proudly served until his honorable discharge in 1988. Dan accepted Christ into his life at an early age and was a member of Rock Temple AME Church. He peacefully passed away on January 27, 2025, leaving behind cherished memories and a legacy of love and service.

After leaving the United States Navy and returning to Georgia, Dan married the love of his life, Sandra "Evette" Lee, in December 1987. Together, they began their life with their daughter Danielle and later expanded it with Dustin, completing their family unit.
