Wyenna was a strong woman of faith who was baptized at an early age at Rock Spring Baptist Church in Mansfield, GA. She later joined Warren United Methodist Church in Atlanta, Georgia in fellowship with her husband. Wyenna was educated within the Jasper County School District in Monticello, Georgia. She attended Tennessee State University in Nashville, TN. She returned home to care for her ailing mother. Once her mother was nursed back to health, she moved to Atlanta, Georgia where she obtained employment at the Army Depot. While working there for about a year, she was united in matrimony to Alphonso Goodrum Camp in 1967. Within that union, they were blessed with two beautiful daughters, Terri Michelle and LaTonia Yvonne.
